



DONALD D. BELLISARIO

Donald Paul Bellisario, is the creator and executive producer of Universal Television's hit series Quantum Leap, which ran for four-and-a-half years on NBC. He was also the creator of other highly successful TV series including Magnum P.L.

In 1965, Don became a copywriter for a small advertising agency in Lancaster, Pennsylvania, and three years later he moved to Dallas to become creative director of the nationally known Bloom Agency. By 1976, after eight years at Bloom, Bellisario was senior vice president, creative director, and a member of the board of directors.


Moving to Hollywood, Bellisario was a producer on Baa Baa Black Sheep for a year and then became the supervising producer on Battlestar Galactica, before becoming involved in development. He created Magnum P.I., the series that made Tom Selleck an international star, as well as Tequila and Bonetti, Tales of the Gold Monkey and Airwolf, serving as executive producer on all four.

In 1987, Don made his first feature, Last Rites, which he wrote, produced and directed. The film, starred Tom Berenger as a priest who uses his church to shelter a young woman from the Mafia. By that time, he had begun development on Quantum Leap, which is now seen in syndication on both the USA and Sci-Fi cable networks and around the world. Quantum Leap let Don explore his interest in recent history, as well as a variety of television formats: comedy, social commentary, action and adventure. In a Hitchcock-esque move, Don appeared on camera in two cameos. He was the mirror image of Dr. Mink in A Portrait for Troian and as a miner in Mirror Image.

In 1991, Don was nominated for the Best Script for Episodic Drama category by the Writer's Guild

of America for the Quantum Leap episode, The Leap Home.

Don was born in Cokeburg, Pennsylvania on August 8. A replica of his father's bar in Cokeburg was used as the backdrop for Quantum Leap's final episode, Mirror Image. Apart from flying helicopters, he is an avid golfer (handicap: 9).



DEAN SLOCKAELL

In a career spanning half the life of the film industry itself, Dean Stockwell has mastered virtually every facet of entertainment— radio, theater, film and television; as an actor, writer, producer and director. In his three-part career, Dean has become the master of the comeback. As a child star, he was under contract to MGM, making 19 films in nine years including the ever-popular Anchors Aweigh (1945) with Gene Kelly and Frank Sinatra. Dean's credits his survival of childhood fame to his mother Betty, who managed to raise two beautiful and talented boys as a single parent. After high school graduation, Dean disappeared into anonymity for five years. "When I ran out of things to do, I went back into the business to try again."

During the "intense leading man" stage of his career, Dean starred in Compulsion on Broadway and was the only original cast member to follow the work to film, for which he won the Best Actor award at the Cannes Film Festival in 1958. Other classics of


this incarnation were Sons and Lovers and A Long Day's Journey into Night, for which Dean won his second Cannes Best Actor award. After making Rapture in France in 1965, he once again dropped out of sight and into the wild and wonderful counter-culture, "hippie" lifestyle. "I found that very fulfilling because I didn't have much of a childhood." During the long dry spell that followed, he performed in such cult films as The Dunwich Horror and The Werewolf of Washington, as well as television guest appearances and regional theater.

The third phase of the veteran actor's career allowed Dean to flex his comedic talents, most notably in the role of Tony "the Tiger" Russo in Married to the Mob, which afforded him an Oscar nomination for Best Supporting Actor in 1988. His exquisite (but brief) portrayal of Howard Hughes in Tucker: The Man and His Dream, earned Dean a New York Film Critic's Circle Award. Other more

recent film appearances include Dune, To Live and Die in L.A., and Paris, Texas.

Significant films seem to be the Stockwell hallmark: The Boy with Green Hair, The Secret Garden, Compulsion, Sons and Lovers, A Long Day's Journey into Night, The Last Movie, Alsino and the Condor, Blue Velvet, Garden's of Stone— these feature films have changed the way society views film and filmmakers.

Those who haven't been Dean Stockwell fans for most of their lives, probably know him best as Sam Beckett's lecherous, holographic Observer in Belisarius Production's dramatic anthology series Quantum Leap. He was honored with his second Golden Globe Award for the role (his first was in 1966 for the film Gentleman's Agreement). Since Quantum Leap's untimely demise, Dean has been busy with several made for TV movies and feature films including Bonanza: The Return, Vansihing Son, In the Line of Duty, Ordinary Heroes, The Innocent, Madonna-Lost Innocence. He lso made guest appearances on Lois and Clark, and Snowy River: The MacGreggor Saga. Yet to air, is the Stephen King mini-series, Langoliers, in which Dean has a starring role.



COTT BAKULA

On the big screen, Scott has completed the feature film, My Family, produced by Francis Ford Coppola for New Line Cinema, due out May 5, 1995. Scott is also set to star in Hanna Barbera's new animated musical Cats Don't Dance, to be released during the Summer of 1996. He will lend his speaking and singing voice to the lead character, Danny, a spunky cat from the midwest who comes to Hollywood to fulfill his dreams of singing and dancing in the movies.

Last year, Scott appeared in the fact-based ABC telefilm Nowhere to Hide. Additionally, Scott previously starred in the NBC movie-of-the-week, Mercy Mission: The Rescue of Flight 771, shot entirely on location in Australia. Of his performance USA Today stated: "Scott Bakula proves his charismatic mettle again, keeping aloft the familiar disaster movie theatrics of

this fact-based movie from the claustrophobic cockpit of a single-engine Cessna."

For his Quantum Leap performance, Scott received Golden Globe nominations for four years by the Hollywood Foreign Press Association, and he received the 1992 Golden Globe for "Best Performance by an Actor in a Television Series, Drama." In addition, he has received four Emmy nominations and has been honored five times by the Viewers For Quality Television.

Scott's feature film credits include Hollywood Pictures' Color of Night, opposite Bruce Willis; the psychological thriller A Passion to Kill; and the Paramount comedy, Necessary Roughness, in which he portrayed a 34-year-old freshman quarterback to a group of outlandish and unconventional college athletes. The Los Angeles Times stated in their review of the latter film, "Scott Bakula scores... Bakula has a laid-back quality that makes him a welcome, easy-to-take presence on the big screen." He made his feature debut in 1990 starring opposite Kirstie Alley in Castle Rock's Sibling Rivalry, directed by Carl Reiner.


Before making his mark on television and film, he was already a well known theatre actor who was acknowledged with a 1988 Tony nomination for his starring role in the Broadway

musical Romance/Romance.

Born in St. Louis, Scott moved to New York in 1976, and he made his Broadway debut as Joe DiMaggio in Marilyn: An American Fable. He later went on to appear in the critically acclaimed Off-Broadway production of 3 Guys Naked From the Waist Down, which he later performed at the Pasadena Playhouse. Before his return to Broadway in Romance/Romance, Scott appeared in both the Los Angeles and Boston productions of Nite Club Confidential.

Currently in release is the Quantum Leap album available on Crescendo Records,

featuring songs that Scott performed during his five year stint on the show.

played the self-serving photographer Clint Beaumont in Miss Deep South. He is just completing work on a feature film with Karen Black called Dark Past. David also worked with Karen on SHHH! Other feature films to his credit include the role of Hank in The Doors, Nighthawks (with Stallone), and Success (with Jeff Bridges). He originated the role of Bruce Niles in the Off Broadway production of The Normal Heart. TV viewers will remember David as Chip Glendenning in One Life To Live.

K (ALLAN

portrayed Mrs. McKensie, the cold, bereaved mother in The Americanization of Machiko. A far cry from her warm, motherly role of Clark Kent's mom in Lois and Clark. K has appeared on many TV series including Star Trek: DS9, L.A. Law, and Coach. Her films include the acclaimed TV film James at 15, The Onion Field, American Gigolo, and Safe.

WUTHLUTH) JIHUW

it would seem, aims for little variety in her career. From putting the moves on Scott Bakula as Margaret Twilley, owner of the Mustangs in Play Ball, to going through the roof in Beetlejuice. Maree will be very recognizable to daytime television viewers from her roles as Charlene Simpson on General Hospital and Maree Horton on Days of Our Lives. She received three Emmy nominations during the ten years she played the evil Stephanie Wyatt on Search for Tomorrow.

OLLO (OETHO

appeared in two different episodes of Quantum Leap. He started working as a production assistant on QL during What Price Gloria. (The first time he met Scott he was dripping wet and wearing a dress!) Otto got his SAG card playing a production assistant in Disco Inferno, and he was also in All Americans as Otto. Otto can be seen next on the episode of Dave's World airing February 27th.

HENTE (OLEMAN

was also in multiple episodes of Quantum Leap
— but all as the same character, Alia, the Evil
Leaper! Renee was recently seen as a guest star
on Diagnosis: Murder, Melrose Place and
Matlock. Her feature films include: Waiting For
Michelangelo, Garden of Eden, and A League
Of Their Own in the role of Alice Gaspers.

TELL (OBBELL

was almost the reason for Al's demise in his role as Chip in A Leap For Lisa. Jeff has also appeared in episodes of Reasonable Doubts and All My Children, and the feature film Talent For The Game. Most of Jeff's work has been in "legit" theatre and on radio, in productions such as Inherit the Wind and The Long Goodbye.

NOTH D. TOTHO

is a favorite of Leapers everywhere as Jimmy's big brother Frank in Jimmy, reprising the role for Deliver Us From Evil. Of course, he also confused Sam in his role as Tonchi in Mirror Image. In addition to providing his acting talents, John has a writer's credit on Quantum Leap for the episode The Beast Within. John has worked extensively in theatre, film, and television. His leading TV roles include seaQuest DSV, Shades of L.A., The Dirty Dozen, and Wildside. He has been a regular and very welcome guest at Quantum Leap conventions.

TRU DUBB

has starred in the title role and also as Emilia in the Hollywood production of Tamara. She has portrayed Emma in La Ronde at the Theatre des Amandiers in Paris and in The Fantasticks at the Edinburgh Festival. On television her guest star appearances include Murder She Wrote, Northern Exposure, Wings, and Murphy Brown. Her work on TV as a regular performer includes Country Comfort, Crime and Punishment, Flesh and Blood, K9, and Trial by Jury. Lisa portrayed archeologist Jenny Will in The Curse of Ptah Hotep.

CHUBIES AND WUBION DREAM

a real life married couple, portrayed hostages Stan and Lyla Pierce in Promised Land. Charles and Marion started their career in television and film only 10 years ago when they moved to Los Angeles. Charles spent most of his working life in the insurance business. They like to work together whenever possible and have done so in episodes of L.A. Law and in Jack The Bear. Separately, Charles was in the popular films When Harry Met Sally and Shaggy Dog, and Marion guest starred on a recent episode of Frasier.

SUSTAN ERENCH

played Miz Melny in Color of Truth. Susan remembers seeing the original production of Tobacco Road and she is currently rehearsing the play for imminent opening at Beverly Hills' Theatre 40, of which she is the founder. You will recognize Susan from her many films and television performances. From Christopher Reeves' lost love in Somewhere in Time to her recurring roles in Little House on the Prairie, Cagney and Lacey, Cannon, and Quincy.

MILLIE GARSON

appeared in two Quantum Leap episodes in very different roles — as the title characters in Play It Again Seymour and Lee Harvey Oswald. He can currently be seen in the theatrical release Speechless. His upcoming films include: The Tie That Binds and Things You Do In Denver When You're Dead.

WIKE CENOAELE

was both Don Gino in Double Identity and Collins, the mine manager, in Mirror Image. Mike has enjoyed an extensive career in television, theatre, and film. Currently he can be seen in his recurring role on E.R., as police officer Al Grabarsky. His previous roles include television work on L.A. Law, Star Trek: DS9, Reasonable Doubts, The Flash, and Family Matters.

SHERAF EBUNCIS HUBBINGLON

was the young woman at the party dancing with Sam in Black on White on Fire. A small role among Sheryl's extensive biography. She had lead roles in the films The Promised and Perfume and a featured role on Lethal Weapon. Sheryl has worked extensively in theatre, most notably as Connie Marie in Shy of Dallas, where she received an NAACP Image Award nomination. As Anneta Barton in Eden she won the Dramalogue Critics Choice Award for Best Actress and was nominated for the L.A. Drama Critic Circle Award.

ABDUINNETH BIAD)

portrayed the girl turning her back on her father's prejudices to be with the man she loves as Susan in Black on White on Fire. An intense drama exploring inter-racial releationships against the backdrop of the 1965 "Watts Riots." Corie is featured in the movies Getting Even With Dad, and Heart and Souls. She is very active in "legit" theatre where her credits include: The Three Sisters, The Merchant of Venice, Marat Sade, The Crucible, and Picnic.

DETH DEUTH

a regular and a favorite at Quantum Leap conventions, you will remember Richard as Captain Galaxy in Future Boy and also as Ziggy the miner in Mirror Image - That too! Richard can currently be seen as Secretary General William Noyce on seaQuest DSV. He starred in the Star Trek: TNG episodes Birthright I and II, on the miniseries "V", and also, for three seasons, on T.J. Hooker with William Shatner.

WICHELLE JOANES

God. Michelle's other work can be seen in several films including the recent Cliffhanger, Outbreak, and Three Men & A Little Lady. On television you will have seen her recurring roles on Knots Landing and Gabriel's Fire. She has also guest starred on Northern Exposure, and Shannon's Deal; for which she was a candidate for an Emmy nomination. Michelle has performed in theaters in New York, Los Angeles, The Edinburgh Festival, and Indianapolis in such classics as Romeo and Juliet and The Seagull.

He has just finished the film The Next Karate Kid, and has been working on Empty Nest. Rodney is a director with the East/West Player's Theatre in Los Angeles, which is the oldest Asian American theatre in America, having been in existence for 25 years.

Rodney's list of credits is extensive, having worked on the feature films Pretty Woman, Gung Ho, Karate Kid II, Protocol, and Teen Wolf, among others. His additional contacts with Quantum Leap alumni have been on Belisaruis Production's Tequila and Bonetti and Tales of the Gold Monkey. He was also a regular on the series Gung Ho with Scott Bakula.

was the beautiful, tango dancing, reluctant bride Katherine Farrington of Sea Bride, the romantic comedy filmed against the elegant backdrop of the Queen Mary in Long Beach.

HOBAN FIATIN

portrayed Annie Wilkins in Dr. Ruth, but let no-one harrass her over her theatrical career. It is going very nicely. Robyn has had lead and starring roles in several films including Dream A Little Dream II, Karate Kid III, and Teen Witch. She currently has a recurring role in Chicago Hope and has enjoyed the same on many TV shows including Young Indiana Jones and Dougie Howser, MD. Robyn has also starred in several TV movies, mainly for Walt Disney Productions. She received a Best Actress Emmy nomination for her role in the After School Special Less Than Perfect Daughter.

TARHHYOJ JANA

has such a busy schedule of television appearances coming up that her appearance as the mother on Star Light, Star Bright must seem a dim and distant memory. She has recently appeared on an episode of Murder She

Wrote and on Bionic Breakdown, the TV movie. Anne will next be seen in the Simon and Simon reunion TV movie, airing on February 23, and then on March 5, she will guest on Kung Fu. Also in the stars for her is a new series called Bear Valley Search and Rescue where she guest stars with Bob Conrad. 
