DEBORAH PRATT

Born in Chicago, Deborah is a graduate of Webster University in St. Louis Missouri. Though her degree is in Psychology, she studied at the Loretto-Hilton Conservatory and utilized her talents with the drama department as well as the Repertory Company for the background she needed to write her thesis on the "Importance of Psycho-Drama for Expression in Children".

She came to California as a singer/dancer and, while in LA, performed in various companies of Broadway shows as well as TV. From there she branched off to begin her career as a song writer. She co-wrote and performed with Lonnie Jordan of "WAR" on two of his solo albums. She also wrote the lyrics for a Showtime special called We open in New Haven as well as performed as a featured member of the cast.


Her performance career prepared her for both Comedy and Drama and led her to acting where she starred in numerous TV shows. She worked in everything from Happy Days for half hour comedies, to one hour dramas such as Airwolf and Magnum PI. In films, her works include Space Hunter and Last Rites. The latter for which she cowrote and performed one of the songs with renowned composer Bruce Broughton.

Deborah's work as a performer and songwriter was a natural segue into writing for Television and Film and in 1981 she went under contract to Columbia to develop projects in both the areas of drama and comedy. In 1984, while performing on the series Airwolf she pitched and specked a script taking her first steps behind the camera. At the same time while on Magnum PI she used her acting as an entry to pitch and write two episodes for what was at the time CBS's biggest series.

From there and including a number of pilots, Deborah ended up with enough knowledge to go behind the cameras full time as Co-Producer of the hit series *Quantum Leap*. In four short years she worked her way up from Co-Producer to Co-Executive Producer and head writer, utilizing her background in acting, music and writing as a natural springboard to understanding the logistics of producing a weekly series. She wrote 22 episodes herself and produced the 97 that are running in successful syndication on USA Network.

She Exec-Produced the first Quantum Leap album for Crescendo Records and helped launch the home video market for Quantum with MCA.

As a writer, she is the winner of the Lillian Gish Award for Women in Film, The Angel Award, the Golden Block Award and the B.E.N. Award. As a producer, she is a three time nominee for the Emmy's as well as the Golden Globes. Deborah is on the Board of Directors for the Writers Guild of America, Media Scope, and All Babies Count, an infant AIDS day school and hospice project.



SCOTT BAKULA

Scott Bakula is probably best known for his five year run on the critically acclaimed NBC drama Quantum Leap. Of his performance, The New York Times stated, "Bakula has the most demanding and rewarding job on weekly television. Mr. Bakula jumps from one character to another with thoroughly impressive and charming aplomb... this actor seems to revel in versatility."

Scott has signed a long-term production agreement with Warner Bros. Television. The multi-faceted agreement calls for him to create, develop, produce, direct and possibly star in a variety of projects under the Warner Bros. Television banner.

Most recently, Scott appeared in The Invaders, a two part mini-series for Fox Television, which was based on the classic 1960's sci-fi series. He starred as Nolan Wood, a former convict who struggles to overcome powerful visions, which control his mind, as he races to expose a plot by alien invaders to conquer the Earth.

Scott Bakula also recently starred in MGM/UA's Lord of Illusions. In this supernatural thriller written and directed by Clive Barker, Scott portrays 'Harry D'Amour', a New York private detective who trails a petty fraudster to Los Angeles where he stumbles upon a mystery involving a world class magician and his wife. Regarding his performance, the Los Angeles Times states, "Lord of Illusions belongs to Bakula. This film gives him a long overdue chance to show he can carry a big picture on the big screen."

In Hanna Barbara's upcoming animated musical Cats Don't Dance, which is scheduled for release during the Summer of 1996, he lends his speaking and singing voice to the lead character Danny, a spunky cat from the midwest who comes to Hollywood to fulfill his dreams of singing and dancing in the movies.

For television, Bakula had a recurring role on Murphy Brown. He appeared in the fact based ABC telefilm Nowhere to Hide and the NBC movie-of-the-week Mercy Mission: The Rescue of Flight 771.

For his Quantum Leap performance, Scott Bakula received Golden Globe nominations for four years by the Hollywood Foreign Press Association, and he received the 1992 Golden Globe for Best Performance by an Actor in a Television Series Drama. In addition, he has received four Emmy nominations and has been honored five times by Viewers For Quality Television.

Scotts's feature film credits include New Line Cinema's MY FAMILY, produced by Francis Ford Coppola, Hollywood Pictures' COLOR OF NIGHT opposite Bruce Willis, the psychological thriller A PASSION TO KILL, and the Paramount comedy NECESSARY ROUGHNESS. The Los Angeles Times stated in their review of the latter film, "Scott Bakula scores... Bakula has a laid back quality that makes him a welcome, easy-to-take presence on the big screen." He made his feature debut in 1990 starring opposite Kirstie Alley in Castle Rock's SIBLING RIVALRY, directed by Carl Reiner.

Before making his mark on television and film, he was already a well known theatre actor who was acknowledged with a 1988 Tony Nomination for his starring role in the Broadway musical Romance/Romance.

Born in St. Louis, Scott moved to New York in 1976, and he made his Broadway debut as Joe DiMaggio in Marilyn: An American Fable. He later went on to appear in the critically acclaimed Off-Broadway production of 3 Guys Naked From the Waist Down, which he later performed at the Pasadena Playhouse. Before his return to Broadway in Romance/Romance, Scott appeared in both the Los Angeles and Boston productions of Nite Club Confidential.

Currently in release is the Quantum Leap album available on Crescendo Records, featuring songs that Scott performed during his five year stint on the show.



DEAN STOCKWELL

There's a reason his nickname has changed from "one take" Stockwell to "the comeback king." In more than 50 years in the entertainment industry Dean Stockwell has risen from the dead more often than Lazarus. Of course when you start at the top you have farther to fall. Opening on Broadway in Innocent Voyage at age six with brother Guy can definitely be considered an auspicious beginning. Spotted by a talent scout, Dean was signed with MGM, making 19 movies in 9 years. He gained stardom and lost his childhood. Taking his first sabbatical from the industry on graduating high school. Dean traveled around the country doing

such odd jobs as working on the railroad and inspecting prunes. Dean soon discovered that anonymity is often a synonym for poverty, and since he was best qualified to perform he returned to acting.

Dean's first comeback brought us such classic films as Long Day's Journey Into Night and Compulsion, in which he reprised his Broadway role. Dean's second career as one of Hollywood's leading angry young men brought a lot of work but not a lot of satisfaction, so when the beatniks and then the hippies came along Dean dropped out once again to pursue the childhood he had lost.

Dean's second comeback was a long hard road. In fact, when approached for a part in *Dune*, David Lynch remarked that he'd thought Dean was dead! Dean's third career seemed, for a while, to have type-cast him as the mafia don, though he turned down Al Pacino's role in *The Godfather*. Now a more mature character actor, yet still leading man material, Dean has proven that his range and scope are boundless.

This season's most recent television credits include an episode of Nowhere Man and the first installment of The Commish, reincarnated as a series of telefilms. Recent film projects include Midnight Blue, Twilight Man, and The Last Resort, and Mr. Wrong which opened this week.

OUR GUESTS

Mark Banning

Mark first met Neil Norman, son of Gene Norman the founder of GNP/Crescendo Records, about 10 years ago at a science fiction convention at the World Con. They discovered their mutual interest in film, television, and sci-fi music. Subsequently Mark was asked to help Neil at other conventions. Finding himself out of work at home in Arizona, Mark jumped at an invitation from Neil to work for Crescendo. He started off in the mail room, moving up to doing artwork for some CD issues and became involved in the technical end of the Star Trek soundtracks. Now Graphic Arts Director and Producer, Mark is a big, enthusiastic fan of all the wildly eclectic Crescendo catalog, and, without his direction, many unusual soundtracks: Lost in Space, Voyage to the Bottom of the Sea, The Time Machine, Alien Nation, to say nothing of Quantum Leap, may not exist.

Julie Barrett

Julie's first book, Quantum Leap A-Z was published by Berkley Boulevard in September 1995, and she's now working on a QL novel. Julie also has a story in the upcoming anthology Time of the Vampires, edited by P.N. Elrod and Martin H. Greenberg.

Ginjer Buchanan was born in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, long enough ago to remember the invention of television. She moved to New York in the early '70's, where she made her living for over a dozen years as a social worker. During that time she also worked as a freelancer for various s.f. publishers, including Pocket Books, where she was the consulting editor for the Star Trek novel program. In 1984, she accepted a full time job as an editor at Ace Books. In 1987, she was promoted to senior editor; in 1994, to Executive Editor. SF and Fantasy and, in January 1996, to Senior Executive Editor and Marketing Director. Besides the Quantum Leap novel program, she is also working on Forever Knight novels, a Star Wars series titled Young Jedi Knights, and an extensive licensing program involving novels based on Marvel Comic characters.

SáMi Chester

(Black on White on Fire)

SáMi (pro. sah-mee) has been in showbusiness since he was seven years old. A native of Chicago, he now divides his life between New York and Los Angeles. However, it was while in Chicago that he first met Deborah Pratt and the two have shared a steady friendship since they were teenagers.

SáMi's credits include Oliver Stone's Born On the Fourth of July; a recurring role as 'Alvin', the hospital orderly, on ABC's Doogie Houser; a series regular on the action drama Human Target with Rick Springfield, and numerous guest appearances on the small screen, theatre, radio and night clubs.

He is very involved in writing and directing and currently is busy re-writing a feature project titled Bank Gob. In between his work and jet-lag SáMi enjoys horseback riding and cooking and taking long naps!

Doran Clark

Doran's role on Quantum Leap as Laura the distraught mother of young Kyle a witness to a murder in Permanent Wave, is one in a long line of television credits. She starred in King's Crossing; was a regular on Nightingales, Emerald Point N.A.S., and The Secrets of Midland Heights; had a recurring role on Jake & The Fat Man; guest starred on numerous others including MacGyver, Matlock, Muder She Wrote, Civil Wars, Father Dowling Mysteries, and Family Ties.

In addition Doran has appeared in several mini-series and movies-of-the-week including Stay the Night for ABC, Perry Mason for NBC, The Law and Harry McGraw on CBS, and Splendor in the Grass for NBC. Her feature film credits include Mickey, The Warriors and starring in Black Eagle

Doran holds a B.A. in Performing Arts from Syracuse University. She is a member of the West End Theatre Company and her theatre credits include the role of Susan in *Detective* Story at Los Angeles' Ahmanson Theatre.

Otto Coelho

was born in 1962 in Modesto, California. He attended Thomas Downey HS (from where George Lucas graduated in 1962), received his BA in Drama at Stanislaus State University and MFA in Acting at UC Irvine. His internship was at the Old Globe Theatre in San Diego. A move to Los Angeles resulted in work as a Production Assistant for Quantum Leap for 8 months. Otto got his SAG card playing a production assistant in Disco Inferno, The role of Otto in All Americans was written for him. Most recent credits include a recurring role on UPN's Live Shot, a recurring role on Maybe This Time, Weird Science, and Misery Loves Company.

Kımberly Cullum

Kimberly Cullum was 10 years old when she played the part of Abagail in part I of The Trilogy and Sam's daughter Sammy Jo in part III. That performance earned her the Youth in Film Award for Best Actress.

Kimberly has been seen in several films including Maverick, Monkey Trouble and a leading role in The Rapture. Her television credits include Star Trek, Fresh Prince of Bel-Air, Empty Nest, Reasonable Doubts, True Colors, as well as recurring roles on VR.5 and Against The Grain and several Movies-of-the-Week.

John D'Aquino



Having been performing from the age of nine (in his hometown of Bethlehem, Pennsylvania) it is no surprise that Daniel Roebuck's credits are extensive and varied. He will be seen on February 24, 1996 taking on the daunting role of Jay Leno in *The Late Shift*, HBO's highly anticipated telefilm. Roebuck describes the task of playing the high-visibility entertainer as "the hardest thing I've ever done".


Daniel is currently in production on an new series for CBS: *Bridges* with Don Johnson, with which he has a recurring role.

Now flying high as the Supervising Producer of the Popular series Lois and Clark (Warner Bros. Television/ABC), for which he has also worked as the Creative Consultant, Chris's work is well known to Quantum Leap fans as both Producer and Screenwriter. Schwartz, best known for his personality representation, achieved initial success in the field of theatre. In his first position in PR at Solters/Roskin/Friedman in New York he worked on the Broadway hits Nicholas Nickleby, 42nd Street and Lena Horne: The Lady and Her Music. After a brief stint with Burnham-Callaghan & Associates working on such accounts as Patti LaBelle, Al Green and Elliot Gould, Schwartz worked on 'night Mother, Hurlyburly and Ma Rainey's Black Bottom with Broadway producers Fred Zollo and Barbara Ligeti.

In 1985, he moved to Los Angeles from New York and joined Nanci Ryder Public Relations, which subsequently became Baker Winoker Ryder. While at BWR, he did the press (and served as associate producer) for the award winning Los Angeles production of Hurlvburly.

The cornerstone of Schwartz' approach to public relations has always been honesty and the importance of personal relationships, coupled with a tireless ability to overcome the negatives inherent to the field.


